

#### **Make Personal Sacrifices**

Moses is an excellent example of a person who made family, personal, and financial sacrifices in order to please the Lord (Heb. 11:24-28). Our willingness to honor God by making sacrifices is another principle that helps us live wisely and well. Here are some other key verses that teach the same truth.

- Romans 12:1-2 "Therefore, I urge you, brothers and sisters, in view of God's mercy, to offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God—this is your true and proper worship."
- **Psalm 51:16-17:** "For you will not delight in sacrifice, or I would give it; you will not be pleased with a burnt offering. My sacrifice, O God, is a broken spirit; a broken and contrite heart you, God, will not despise."
- Mark 12:41-44: This is the story of the poor widow who gave all she had, highlighting the importance of giving from the heart, even when it is a seemingly small sacrifice.
- Matthew 20:28: "...just as the Son of Man did not come to be served, but serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many."

True sacrifice involves offering ourselves completely to God, including our thoughts, actions, and desires. Internal faith ("broken and contrite heart") is more valuable to the Lord than ritualistic or empty religious practices. Jesus' sacrifice on the cross is the ultimate example of selfless love.
