In my message this past Sunday I discussed the sixth commandment not to kill (murder). Jesus pointed out that kingdom righteousness must deal with the anger that causes murderous feelings and actions. Part of our problem as Christians and as human beings is making false assumptions.

We find ourselves operating on assumptions from time to time that prove to be all wrong from square one. Like the new salesman carrying an important-looking document and walked over to an office employee who was standing by the paper shredder. He asked, "Can you show me how to operate this machine?" The other man said, "Sure, just flick this switch to turn it on, then put your paper in that slot. That's all there is to it." The salesman said, "Thanks." He followed the instructions, then turned and asked, "Now, how do you set it to make three copies?" Ouch!

Scripture addresses the danger of assumptions. "Fools have no interest in understanding; they only want to air their own opinions (Prov. 18:2). Actor Henry Winkler was spot on: "Assumptions are the termites of relationships." We can save ourselves a great deal of frustration and anger by having the courage to ask a lot more questions.
