Spring Forward

Another thing that spring brings is that crazy time change. Many people are not very fond of bouncing clocks back and forth. But, like it or not, we have to fall in line and "spring forward."

After the long winter of their captivity, God gave Israel these optimistic promises, *"See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it? I am making a way in the wilderness and streams in the wasteland"* (43:19).

This applies to our lives. We know that in order to move into a new season and spring forward by faith, we have to let go of the old season. The previous verse makes this very clear, *"Forget the former things; do not dwell on the past"* (Isa. 43:18).

Yes, grief is sometimes necessary before we can pursue a new adventure. But God never meant for grief to last forever. If we get stuck, talking to a close friend or a solid Christian counselor can often help us.

As spring starts to surface and the trees begin to bloom, we can see God's reminder to align our hearts to the new thing He's doing. Pray this prayer with me this week.

Lord God Almighty, thank you for making me into the person You want me to be. I admit, Lord, that sometimes it is hard to let go of old things even when I know they are holding me back. Help me, Jesus, to truly see this spring season for what it is: a wonderful reminder of how beautiful change can be. As flowers begin to adorn the trees and fresh grass rises up from the ground, renew in me the strength to let go of the past and move forward in my faith journey with You. In Your name, Amen.

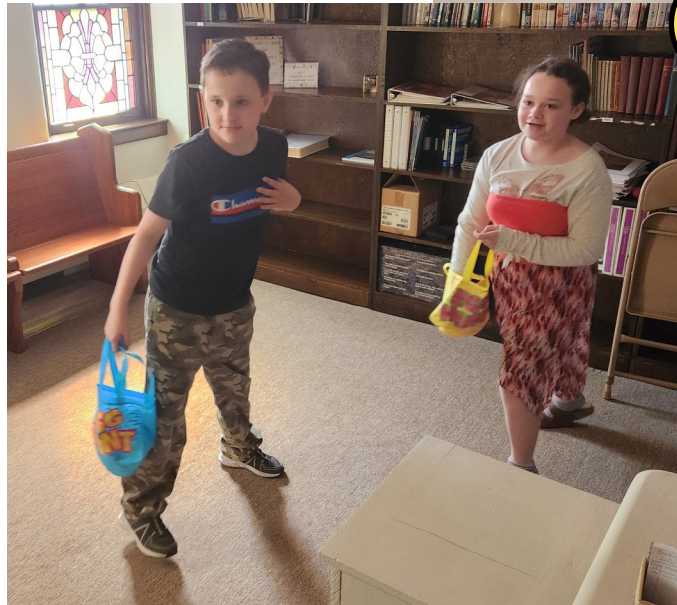

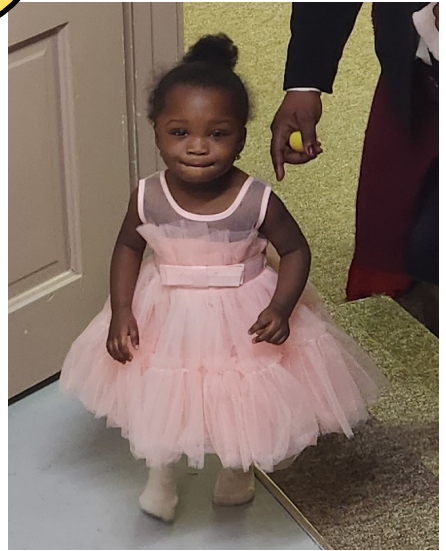
