

#### **Pastor Ponderings During Prayer Retreat**

Here is a small sampling of my thoughts and reflections (in color) during my recent Continuing Education retreat. It was a rich and valuable time.

Hosea 10:12 – Sow for yourself righteousness; Reap in mercy; Break up the fallow ground, For it is time to seek the Lord, Till He comes and rains righteousness on you. The ground of Israel's relationship with God had been neglected, unplowed, and untended. The prophet challenged them to prepare the ground and get back into the routines or disciplines involved in seeking the Lord.

Hosea 6:1-3 – Come, let us return to the Lord; For He has torn, but He will heal us; He has stricken, but He will bind us up. After two days He will revive us; On the third day He will raise us up, That we may live in His sight. Let us know, Let us pursue the knowledge of the Lord. His going forth is established as the morning; He will come to us like the rain, like the latter and former rain to the earth. The chosen people had only begun to experience the negative results of their sinfulness. They perceived it would be an easy and quick process to turn back to YHWH at any time. Yes, the Creator is as faithful as the sunrise, and always ready to receive us. But we must never underestimate the complexity of the webs that our sin causes. Unravelling and relinquishing sins' deadly consequences can take months or years; many previously treasured relationships or positions can never be fully recovered.

Isaiah 64:4,5 - For since the beginning of the world Men have not heard nor perceived by the ear, Nor has the eye seen any God besides You, Who acts for the one who waits for Him. You meet him who rejoices and does right-eousness, Who remembers You in Your ways... The only true God of the Bible is unique and above all other so-called gods. The Lord acts on behalf of those who love Him, honor Him, and walk in His ways. Such faithfulness toward God entails waiting, and making the decision to rejoice in the Lord no matter what happens.

Proverbs 1:7 – The fear of the Lord is the beginning of knowledge, But fools despise wisdom and instruction. This circle begins with a heart-felt awe, respect, and yearning to please God. This foundational orientation opens our minds and hearts up to the Lord in everything. We increasingly notice and experience Christ invading every area of reality, and thus strengthening our faith.

Colossians 3:2,3 – Set your minds on things above, not on things on the earth. For you died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. Christians are to exemplify eternal living and bring it to bear on everything around them. Eternal living is life caught up in God.


